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RULES, REGULATIONS, AND PREMIUM LIST FOR THE79TH ANNUAL FAIR

Entry fees and maintenance fees may be subject to change due to the State of Illinois funding.

All livestock brought before 24 hours of the designated time – acharge of \$1.00 per head will be charged.

- 1. The management of the Washington County Fair Associationreserves to its Executive Committee the final and absolute right tointerpret these Rules and Regulations and settle all matters in question and differences that may arise in connection with holding, managing, or promoting the Fair. The Superintendent of each department will have charge of the department. But the executive committee of this Association is hereby vested with full authority to construe all Rules and Regulations of this Association. The Executive Committee is composed of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer.
- **2.** The Judges' decision will be final, unless complaint can showfraud or other irregularity in placing awards. Such complaint as anincompetent judge will not be considered by management.
- **3.** A protest on award must be made in writing, accompanied byan affidavit setting forth the grounds of protesting the award and adeposit of \$25.00 accompanying the protest. In the event of theprotest being sustained, the \$25.00 will be returned to the complainant. If the protest is not sustained, the \$25.00 shall be forfeited to the Association.
- **4.** All livestock exhibited at the County fair must comply withthe ruling sent out by the Department of Agriculture Division of Livestock Industry.
- **5.** In all purebred classes, the exhibitor may be required to furnish the proper certificates of their respective class. Any misrepresentation of age will be considered fraud and the animal will be sent back and no award placed. This will be strictly enforced.
- **6.** All animals must be exhibited in such places at such times as the Superintendent shall place and be ready to parade at call of the president. All animals that have been awarded a premium, must be led in the parade. Refusal to lead in the parade will be a forfeiture of the premium awarded the animal not led
- 7. No premium will be awarded to any animal, or group of animals, unless shown in the ring for judging.
- **8.** All stalls and pens must be reserved by June 30, 2023 by mail. Maintenance fees must accompany entries. The ExecutiveCommittee reserves the right to reopen entries in all classes that are not filled.
- **A.** Beef cattle must be on the grounds Tuesday, July 11, 2023 at 12:01 a.m. and released Friday, July 14, 2023 at 12:01 a.m. Registration papers must be brought to the fair office. All entriesmust be in the fair office by Friday, June 30, 2023, 12:00 by mail with maintenance fees.
- B. Dairy cattle must be on the grounds, Tuesday, July 11, 2023at 6:00 a.m. and released Friday, July 14,

- 2023 at 6:00 a.m. Registration papers must be brought to the fair office. All entriesmust be in the fair office by Friday, June 30, 2023, 12:00 by mail with maintenance fees.
- C. Sheep must be on the grounds Tuesday, July 11, 2023 at 12:01 a.m. and released Friday, July 14, 2023 at 12:01 a.m. Registration papers must be brought to the fair office. All entriesmust be in the fair office by Friday, June 30, 2023, 12:00 by mail with maintenance fees. Sheep pens will have no less than five head per pen.
- D. Manure must be at least 6 feet away from barn in a designated area with no strings, wire, cans, etc. A fine of \$50.00will be charged if not obeyed.
- 9. Any animal showing symptoms of a disease will be excluded from exhibition.

- **10.** Entries must be sent to Secretary, Audrey Brueggemann, PO Box 302, Nashville, Illinois 62263 (Phone: in operating or walking, running or riding on the Fair 327-3535) by June 30, 2023 by mail. Social Security numbers Association property. must be on entry form before check will be issued. Maintenance fees must accompany entries. - 11. MAINTENANCE FEES must accompany the entry forms. 12. REGISTRATION PAPERS will be in the fair office the day livestock is reported on fairgrounds. Registration papers WILL NOT BE RETURNED. Registration papers copied at the fairgrounds will be charged a fee.
- 13. All articles or animals competing for a premium must possess more than ordinary merit. The judge has been instructed to disqualify any entry not worthy of a premium.
- 14. The Association reserves the right to withdraw any class in any department that does not fill satisfactorily.
- 15. In no case will a class or special show be added to the premium list. The list will stand as printed. Please do not ask. 16. There will be no change of the exhibitors' names or rearranging any entries after the entry is made except in case of an error on the entry book.
- **17.** The Association will use every reasonable precaution to safeguard the public, exhibitors, employees, and exhibits but positively will not be liable for death, loss, theft, damage, or injury to person, animal, or article.
- **18.** Any feature which in the minds of the Executive Committee is objectionable may be excluded from the grounds without recourse. 19. All concessions must be operated to comply with the Illinois State Laws on gambling and pure food laws.
- 20. The Executive Committee reserves the right to close entries when classes are full and also to re-open entries in classes that have not been filled.
 - 21. Open to World.
- 22. Entries close when classes or stalls are filled.
- 23. Exhibitors will need a 3 prong heavy duty electrical cord to pass fire Marshal inspection.
- 24. The Fair Association reserves the right to enforce all of the rules and laws, rules and regulations that are acceptable to control all stands, shows, concessions, or other attractions. And immediately close same on oral notice when any law, rule, or regulation is violated. No rental fee will be refunded.
- 25. The Fair Association will not be held liable for death, loss of property, theft, injury to persons or animals. Further, the Fair Association is giving fair warning that hazards may from time to time exist that could cause injury to persons or

- property and that all participants should use extreme caution

2023 Exhibition Livestock Health
Requirements County Fairs
GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

These Exhibition Health Requirements apply to all livestock present at the fair including those animals that are not entered in competitive events.

1. Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits. All out-of-state animals shall require an entry permit.

Entry permit numbers are available online at

http://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx.

2. All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) which shows that the animal meets all health requirements for the State of Illinois. CVI's shall be made available to Bureau of Animal Health Personnel on request. If an official electronic CVI is utilized, the exhibitor should be able to log on and show bureau of Animal Health Personnel the completed CVI.

CVI means a legible record made on an official form from the state of origin which has been issued, signed, and dated by an accredited veterinarian and which shows the name and address of the animal's owner or exhibitor and the results of all required tests or vaccinations. A CVI shall list only one animal identification per line; shall be presented on the form on which it was initially issued; and shall not be corrected, changed or altered in any manner.

- **3.** All animals shall be officially identified. The animal(s) official identification shall be recorded on the CVI. **4.** If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.
- **5.** CVI for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
- **6.** CVI for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.
- 7. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon entry to any Illinois fair or exhibition. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases shall be immediately withdrawn and held in quarantine at the owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until the animal is released to return to the owner's premise.

Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination shall not be permitted to exhibit and are subject to quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.

Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses shall not be exhibited and are subject to immediate quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.

8. Illinois Department of Agriculture personnel or designee may collect blood, tissue, milk, or urine samples from any animal being exhibited and/or raced at any Illinois fair to test for the

presence of illegal drugs or banned substances. Examination techniques, such as ultrasound, may also be used at anytime while the animals are on the grounds of any Illinois fair or exhibit.

The Illinois Department of Agriculture or designee may collect urine, blood, tissue, or other test samples from exhibition animals at the time of slaughter.

9. All exhibitors of animals at any Illinois fair or exhibition shall comply with the provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act. If violations are observed, the animal(s) will be excused from exhibition and ordered removed from the grounds with all awards being forfeited. Any practice or deviation from normal, accepted care, including physical, medical or mechanical application, shall constitute a violation of show rules and may

result in the animal(s) disqualification and removal from the fairgrounds.

10. Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae, or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry.

CATTLE

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be either a fully healed and legible tattoo, approved official ear tag, registration number (can only be used if the tattoo is recorded on the registration certificate or for breeds where pictures are acceptable), or individual brands, if brand is recorded on the registration certificate.

Illinois Cattle

Brucellosis

Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle. Tuberculosis

Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis- Free State. Tuberculin testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Please note: Illinois calves under 6 months of age, and Illinois steers are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

DISCLAIMER

"The Department of Agriculture shall use its best efforts to secure sufficient appropriations to fund premiums. In any year for which the General Assembly of the State of Illinois fails to make appropriation sufficient to pay such premiums, premium amounts may not be accurately reflected in the Premium Book."

Out-of-State-Cattle

All out-of-state cattle are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at http://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx. Brucellosis

- **1.** Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
- **A.** Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd. **B.** Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four (24) months of age.
- **C.** Animal originated from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so classified).

- **D.** Steers and spayed heifers are not required to be tested for brucellosis.
- **2.** The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition. Tuberculosis
 - 1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States
- **A.** No tuberculin test required. All cattle, including steers, originating from an Accredited Tuberculosis Free State, may enter Illinois for exhibition when accompanied by a CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days.
- **2.** Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
- **A.** Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
- **B.** The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculin test conducted **within 30** days prior to exhibition.
- **C.** Cattle that enter Illinois for exhibition and remain in Illinois (animal does not return to the state of origin within 30 days) must be isolated and retested for TB 60-120 days from the last official TB test date.

SWINE

Illinois Swine Identification

- **1.** Swine shall be identified by an official ear tag, tattoo, or recognized breed ear notch.
- 2. Ear notch identification is acceptable for all barrows, crossbred gilts, and breeding swine. (Note: Ear notch identification of crossbred swine does not satisfy USDA identification requirements for interstate movement or official testing.)

 Brucellosis

Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois swine. <u>Pseudorabies</u>

Pseudorabies testing is not required for Illinois swine. Out-of-State Swine

All out-of-state swine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at: http://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx. Identification

- **1.** Individually identified by an official ear tag, tattoo, or recognized breed ear notch.
- **2.** Ear notch identification <u>is not</u> acceptable for crossbred animals.

Brucellosis

- **1.** Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to exhibition unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
- **A.** Originate immediately and directly from a validated brucellosis-free herd.
 - **B.** Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free

state. **2.** Swine brucellosis tests for exhibition shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory.

Pseudorabies 1. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V

- state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement. 2. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.
- **3.** Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage I or II state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within the 10 days prior to entry.
- **4.** Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine.

SHEEP

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Market Lambs

All market lambs must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that show lamb fungus can be identified. **Illinois Sheep**


- **1.** Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
- **2.** For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

All out-of-state sheep are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available online at http://entrypermit.agr.illinois.gov/Login.aspx.

- **1.** Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
- **2.** For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

GOATS

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Ears should be used for tattooing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used.

classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited

in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.

2. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include

the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different. **Out-of-State Goats**

If there is any suspicion or questioning, tractor will be subject to disqualification by the superintendent. Entries will be collected at the fairgrounds from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. the day of the pull. No entry will be allowed into the pit area without a pit pass. Contestants will not be allowed to drive a tractor or truck that is knowingly owned or primarily driven by a non county resident. All contestants will honor this rule. Superintendent has final say on all complaints.

Tractors and trucks must be weight before you hook to the sled. Weights must be fastened to the tractors and trucks. Blowers will not be permitted in the 4500, 5500, 7000, and 9500 lb. classes, but will be permitted in all other classes. These classes will weigh in at the Fairgrounds: 4500, 5500, 7000, 9500, 12000, 14000 lb. tractors and 8500 lb. trucks. These classes will weigh in at Pitchford Elevator: 18000 and 22000 lb. **BRING SCALE TICKET FROM ELEVATOR, IT IS REQUIRED FOR ENTRY.** 3.

All classes will have a 3,000 RLM limit.

Wheelie bars are highly recommended for all tractors.

Weights include driver. Driver will furnish his own clevis. This contest is designed only for amusement purposes, and all contestants should conduct themselves in good sportsman-like manner.

6.

Drawbars must not be over 20 inches from the ground. Truck hitches must be stock hitches and must be at stock bumper height. 7.

All pulls must start with a tight hitch, no jerking permitted. Contestants will be allowed two consecutive attempts and 75 feet to start sled.

No dual wheel or four-wheel drive tractors will be permitted in the 4500, 5500, 7000, 9500, 11000, 12000, 14000 classes. 9.

Driver must remain seated at all times otherwise driver will be disqualified. No passengers will be permitted in trucks or tractors. 10.

Tire size is limited to 18x42, 20.8x38 on all tractor classes except dual wheel where there is no limit. There is also no limit in the truck class on tire size. NO CUT TIRES EXCEPT FOR 4500, 5500, 7000 AND OPEN.

No weights will be permitted on the 3-point hitch, or be positioned to interfere with hooking or unhooking of sled to drawbar. 14.
